## The Workshops of the $5^{\rm th}$ IEEE European Symposium on Security and Privacy — Preface —

Since 1980, the IEEE Symposium on Security and Privacy has been the premier forum for presenting developments in computer security and electronic privacy, and for bringing together researchers and practitioners in the field.

Following this story of success, IEEE initiated the European Symposium on Security and Privacy (EuroS&P), which is organized every year in a European city. In 2020, EuroS&P and all co-located events were due to take place in Genoa, Italy, but due to the Covid-19 pandemic, they have been rescheduled to an all-digital conference experience happening on September 7-11, 2020.

At the end of 2019, EuroS&P invited proposals for workshops to be co-located with the main symposium. Proposers were asked to indicate how the workshop would provide a forum to address a specific topic at the forefront of security and privacy research. More specifically, workshop proposals were evaluated according to the following criteria:

- Quality of proposal,
- Timeliness and suitability for the EuroS&P community,
- Novelty with respect to other workshops and forums,
- Interest, impact, the relevance of the topic,
- Anticipated attendance level, and
- Organizers' experience.

After a competitive selection process, 11 workshops were selected, with 8 scheduled as pre-conference workshops and 3 as post-conference workshops:
